Sample VASCULAR ACCESS DEVICE Standing Order

Peripheral Venous Access should be established on order of a physician according as follows:

- On all patients whose <u>IV therapy is likely to exceed 72 hours</u>, a POWERWAND™ (3.1-3.9" midline) catheter should be placed and secured using the accompanying securement device.
- On all patients who have had <u>2 unsuccessful peripheral IV attempts</u>, and whose intended stay is likely to exceed 44 hours, a POWERWAND (3.1-3.9" midline) catheter should be placed and secured using the accompanying securement device.
- On all patients whose diagnosis (DRG) has been designated by the Institution to require
 an extended dwell catheter, e.g. pneumonia, CHF, etc., a POWERWAND (3.1-3.9"
 midline) catheter should be placed and secured with the accompanying securement
 device.

NOTE: The POWERWAND is a power-injectable, midline catheter capable of dwelling up to 29 days, or longer if deemed appropriate by a clinician; it is not a central line and should not be used to administer infusates (TPN, 3% saline, vesicants, mannitol) requiring central venous access.
